Excuses, excuses, excuses. We've become expert at shaking the finger of blame. For every ill in our life we find the appropriate culprit and then excuse ourselves from any responsibility. Oh, I would fix that, we say to ourselves, but I can't *because...*

The story of the paralytic man lowered through the roof stands in sharp contrast to this blame game. Established in 1884, the Black and Indian Mission Office supervises the Collection – the only annual appeal mandated by the Third Plenary Council – and distributes these funds as diocesan grants. Through the years, the funds from the annual appeal have been responsible for continuing the Church's faithful in supporting the evangelization needs of the Black and Native American communities in the United States. Each year, Ordinaries appeal to the Black and Indian Mission Office for help in the tasks of parish support and evangelization. It is only through the constant generosity of Church members toward the Collection that such efforts are realized.

**ASH WEDNESDAY** marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain redemption. The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance.



### **LENTEN RULES FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday – February 22, and Good Friday, April 6, are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. **Fasting** is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed, two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. **Abstinence** is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for the renewal of baptism at Easter.
